**Ben:** Same here. Tomorrow let's visit the Lake District – then we'll have the best of both worlds.

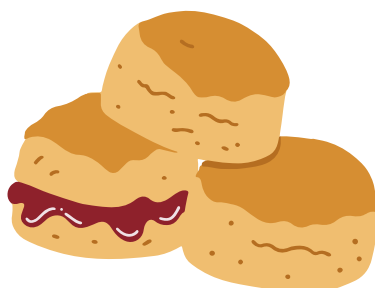
**Holly:** Great idea! And we must make time for afternoon tea in York.
