**Tom:** Maybe we'll be lucky. And after that, we could climb Ben Nevis – we'd feel on top of the world.

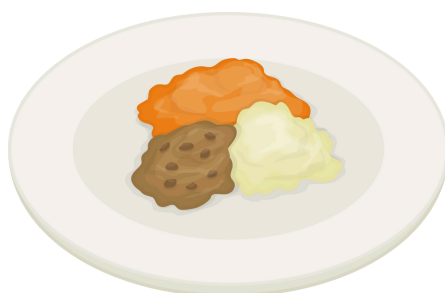
**Emma:** Good idea. Then let's visit the Isle of Skye – such a change of scenery.
