Warm-up

Part 1. Students look at the words "school lunch" and discuss the first thing that comes to mind.

Part 2. Students discuss the questions.

Part 3. Students read the statements and discuss which one they agree with most. Encourage students to explain their choice.

Video activity

Part 1. Introduce the video title. Students choose three countries and predict what school lunch is like in each one.

Part 2. Students watch the video. As they watch, ask them to notice anything that surprises them and anything that was different from what they expected.

Part 3. Students watch the video again.

Part 4. Students match the country with the idea it shows about food and culture and then discuss the questions.
