### Warm-up discussion

Students look at the words and give one short definition for kindness. Students then share one example of kindness they've seen recently.

#### **Vocabulary**

Part 1. Students match the words/phrases to their meanings.

#### **Answer key:**

- 1. Give a compliment
- 2. Pay it forward
- 3. Listen carefully
- 4. Lend a hand
- 5. Brighten someone's day
- 6. Check in

## Video activity

- Part 1. Before watching the video, students discuss the questions.
- Part 2. Students watch the video.
- Part 3. Students discuss the questions based on the video.
- **Part 4.** Students read the line from the film and discuss the questions.

In this context, *ripple* refers to the spreading effect of one small act of kindness — like waves in water. It symbolises how a single kind action can inspire many others, far beyond the original moment.

### **Speaking**

Part 1. Students complete the sentences with their own ideas.

#### **Example responses:**

When I give a compliment, I like to see someone smile. I usually lend a hand when a colleague needs help.

- Part 2. Students give details about a time they did one of the acts of kindness.
- Part 3. Students read each situation and say what they would do.

Part 4. Students choose one small act of kindness they could do this week and share their idea.

**Part 5.** Students read the quotes and share which one they agree with the most. Encourage students to explain their choice, and give a real-life example that supports it.

### <u>Reflection</u>

Students finish the sentences with their own ideas.

# Wrap-up task (optional homework)

Students write 8–10 sentences about a kind gesture that made a difference in their life, using at least 5 of today's vocabulary items *or* record a 2-minute story about a moment of kindness they gave or received.
