Part 1. Students read the text and notice how it describes the feelings, traditions, and foods of autumn.

Part 2. Students answer the questions based on the text.

Answer Key:

1. Energised by the air / winding down with shorter days.
2. Harvest festivals, Thanksgiving, Mid-Autumn Festival.
3. Comfort food, turkey, pumpkin pie, mooncakes.

4. Golden leaves reminding people of childhood/school/family.
5. It closes one season but prepares for another.

Part 3. Students look at these sentences from the reading and explain what each phrase means in their own words.

1. **Crisp air** = cool, fresh autumn weather that feels sharp but pleasant.
2. **Wind down** = relax, slow down after activity.
3. **Nostalgia** = warm but slightly sad feelings about the past.
4. **Endings can also be beginnings** = changes can create opportunities.
